## **Town Beach Reserve**

**Location:** Robinson Street, Broome

**Type:** Community Park.

**Closest accessible parking:** Onsite

**Pick up / set down bay:** No.

**Closest Public transport:** Town Bus stop at Broome Museum, about 10 minutes away.

**Closest accessible toilet:** Onsite (see Report Town Beach Reserve Public Toilet).

**Pick up / set down bay:** No.

**Accessible Parking:** There are 2 designated disabled parking bays available in the ample car park.

**Signage:** There are directional beach signs on nearby thoroughfares and clear marked sign in bold lettering at the entry to the reserve.

**Access:** Access to all areas is good (Y++) with barrier free brick paved pathways of 1500mm leading to grassy picnic areas and covered seating areas.

**Beach access:** Gentle grassy sloping leads on to the beach. Alternatively, there is access by the boat ramp via a sloping of 4.8 degree. There are no lifeguards on duty at any time.

### **Onsite facilities:**

**Playground:** The playground is with sand underfoot and sailcloth for shade. It has a 160mm lip surround to contain the sand. There are swings, slides, climbing frames and Merry-go rounds. These are well spaced apart and the access is good.

**Seating:** The seating area is brick paved throughout. There are two fixed bench tables and bench seats with a wheelchair access at either end of the tables. The seats have good knee clearance with a seating height of 500mm and a tables heights of 800mm.
